MESSAGE FROM PASTOR GREG......

'I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home.' Jesus said to him, 'No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'

Luke 9

I don't know much about plowing a field. Actually that's too generous--I don't know anything about plowing fields.

Most scholars tend to read this scripture to mean that when you plow a field you don't look back, because when you look back you lose your line and plow crooked rows. Now, that I understand, because I have mowed a lot of lawns in my lifetime, big and small. When you plow or mow, most people choose the spot in the distance and aim for that spot. Once you get the first row done, if successfully straight, the rest is a piece of cake.



But of course, Jesus wasn't giving farming advice so much as he was pointing to the challenges of following him. The necessity for focus and drive. Singlemindedness and dedication. If you can't do that, then you aren't fit for the kingdom. Like a farmer or mower who keeps looking back, your rows are going to be crooked, your witness distorted.

About the Tanzania Arusha Program

In 2021, Convoy of Hope worked with 408 women in the Arusha Region to help them farm a half acre of maize each. Through the provision of seed, fertilizer, pesticides, and technical assistance, each farmer saw exponential increase in their productivity and profitability. Average harvest was 1,000 kg

of maize per ½ acre, whereas previous harvests in the area averaged 250-500 kg per ½ acre. Due to this success, Convoy of Hope is extending this program to assist a greater population throughout the Arusha Region. In 2022 the number of participants increased to approximately 600 women. Subsequent years will also increase the number of participants by about 50%.
